Once you update your instance, most implementations will be already setup to begin using Send. An exception to this is if you are using a non-default **mapped volume for attachment storage**.

The files attached to file Sends are stored in a send subdirectory of the existing attachments volume (for example, ./bwdata/core/at tachments/send). This is dictated by the globalSettings_send_baseDirectory= environment variable, which has the following default configuration in global.override.env:
